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## Part -A

*The Plan of Action chalked out by IQAC for the session 2011-12.*

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of the college reviews the feedback of students given at the end of the session and prepared plan of Action for 2011-2012. The necessary action to be taken as:-

1. Shift in Classroom Transactions Pedagogy to ensure dynamism and to align the curriculum transaction with the ever changing needs. The major thrust areas to be covered are
  - Installation of server to maintain the Library Record, attendance record and evaluation of students through Data Soft Tech Software.
  - Providing class room instruction through power point presentation/ discussion on pre- provided content resources/ assignment/ team teaching of at least one unit.
  - Recording & self analysis of Micro and Macro lessons- students will record and upload their lessons on college portal for peer and teacher feedback.
2. (a) Ability Grouping & Remediation: - Students will be divided into three groups on the basis of performance after first House test. The groups will be orientated for two days.  
After second House test, the each group will be given special classes for a fortnight.  
(b) The remediation resource material & Glossary of technical terms prepared by faculty for ability groups will be uploaded on blog. The impact factor will be studied for each student.
3. All the students will prepare their Portfolio under guidance of their tutorial incharges. This portfolio will include three aspects:-
  - Self expression; students can express his/her view in own words on any topic/current issue/personal motivational anecdotes/life goals.
  - Diagnostic testing of self by using various psychological tests.
  - Reflective observations/reports/projects for socio-cultural improvement (optional project).

4. Individualized need based counseling session will be organized for students by counseling cell.
5. Time Table will be rescheduled to provide break of 40 minutes in three separate groups of 100 students each.
6. The orientation programme will also include the information regarding attendance, internal evaluation and ability grouping mechanism.
7. Maintenance of record of each activity by incharges more systematically.
8. Institute will introduce a new Add-on- course “Life & Employability Skills” from the session (2011-12).
9. Organizing one week faculty development programme in the form of Research Workshop.

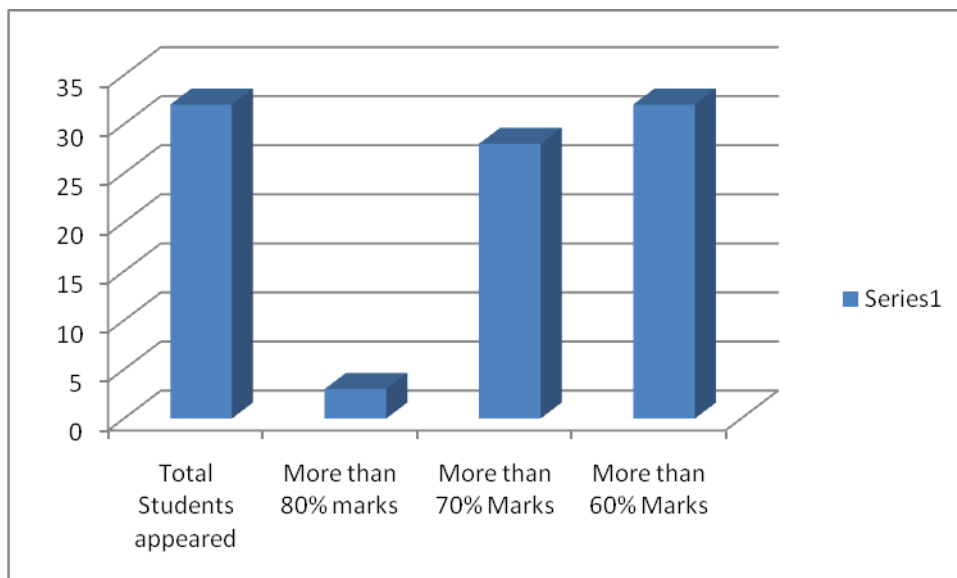
#### 1.1 ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE (2010-11)

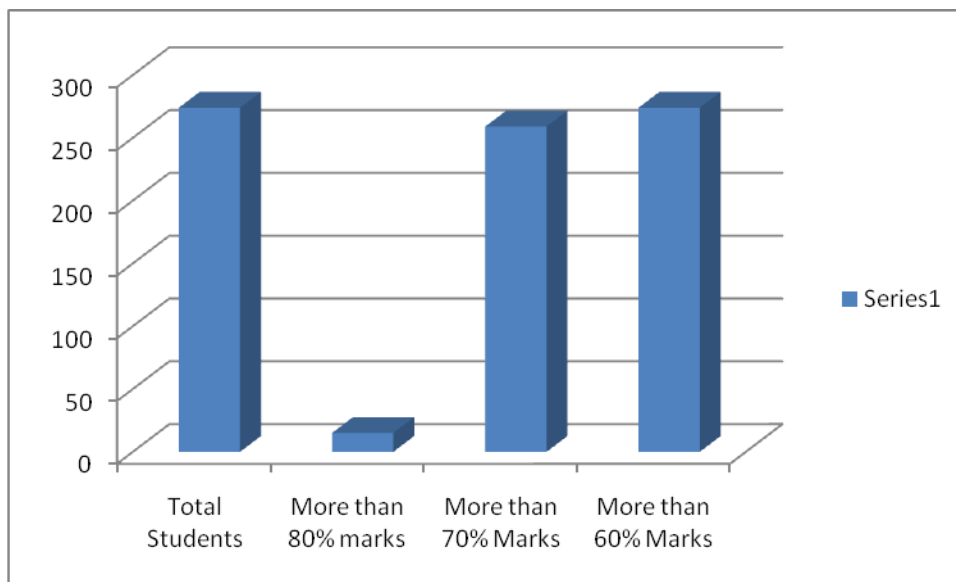

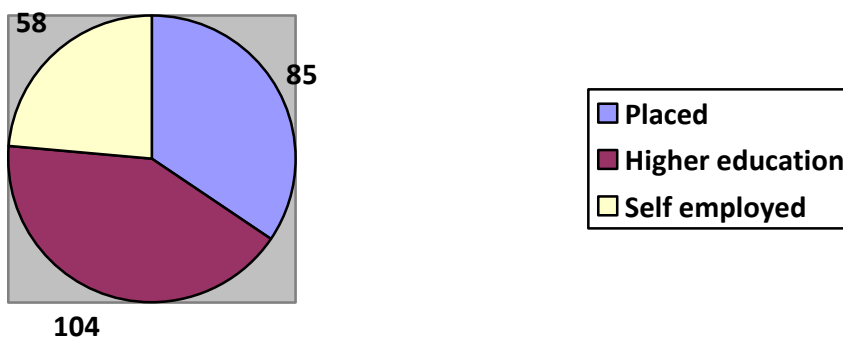

#### **Effect of Mobile Learning on Achievement of B.Ed. Students**

##### **Introduction**

Among all technological devices available in our era, mobile technologies including mobile phones are the most popular ones, and they have gained great importance in day to day work particularly in young people's lives. All over the world – except Canada-the mobile phones outnumber the personal computer 5 to 10 times (prensky,2004).

Mobile Learning is a young discipline that is gaining more and more attention because of its promises for numerous applications including education. They have great potential; to provide supplemental practices for students outside the school, round the clock accessibility, use impulsive urge to read SMS for learning. With this consideration a research study was conducted by our institute on the topic “ Effect of M-Learning on English vocabulary of pre-service teacher trainees.”

##### **Objectives of the Study**

- To find out the effect of M-Learning on vocabulary improvement of the students.
- To find out the opinion of pre-service teacher trainees on mobile phone based learning system.
- To realize these objectives 100 pre-service teacher trainees were selected and divided into two equal groups (Experimental and Control). Pre Test -Post Test experimental design was applied.

##### **Procedure**

1. Construction of vocabulary modules

(Vocabulary was selected from technical terminology of Paper-II of B.Ed. Punjab University Chandigarh)

2. Pre test was administered.
3. The messages were send every half an hour in leisure hours by the investigator to the experimental group. The messages were sent for a period of 24 days and a word was sent four times in all.
4. The control group was given hand outs of the vocabulary modules.
5. Post test was administered.

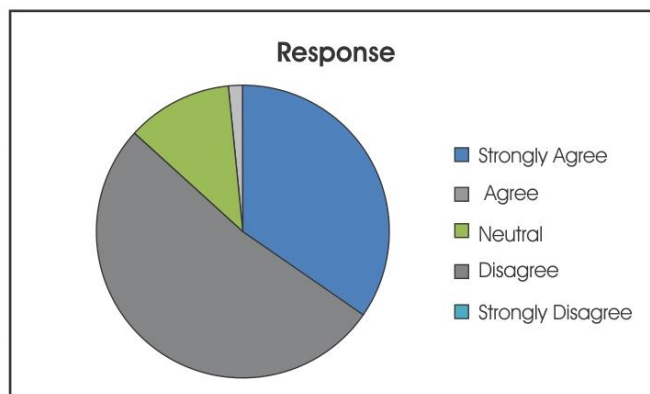

### Findings

- The students like M-Learning as a good Mode to improve the vocabulary.
- M-Learning has a significant effect on the vocabulary of pre-service teacher trainees.

### Impact Factor

From the result of this study we got an idea to use M-Learning to enhance the performance of students. It is observed that the pupil teachers are not aware about using the technical and specific terminology appropriately in their written expression. They are using terminology in a very lax manner. Consequently, their achievement



suffers. We attempted to harness the potential of M-Learning by providing the glossary of technical terms related with the subjects of B.Ed. through group SMS as well as hand outs (since 2009-10).

### Practice

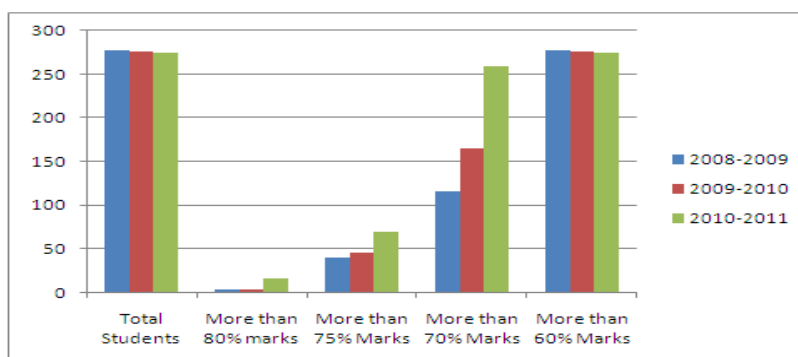
Step 1: Construction of glossary modules:

Subject Teachers prepared, discussed & finalized the glossary modules of technical terms in their respective subjects

Step 2: The finalized glossary modules were made available to students through two modes :

- i) hand outs in the form of hard copy .
- ii) Through group SMS: The messages having technical glossary items with brief description were sent to the pupil teachers as per the fixed time schedule acceptable to majority of students.
- 3) Evaluation of house tests with special consideration to the specific terminology.
- 4) Feedback was taken regarding the practice.

### **Study of possession and usage of Mobile Phones**

#### **Objective**

To assess the level of possession of mobile phones by secondary level students.

#### **Sample**

The sample consisted of 500 secondary students of Ludhiana was selected from 18 teaching practicing schools.

#### **Tool**

A self prepared questionnaire was used for conducting survey.

#### **Data collection and Statistical Techniques**

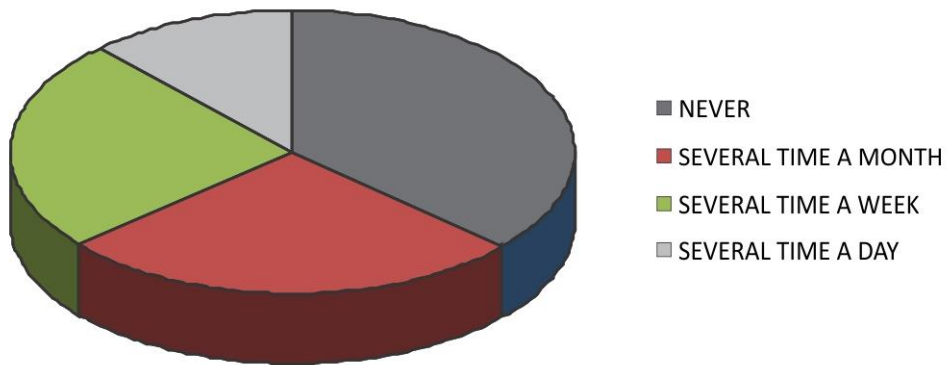
Data was collected by questionnaire of 20 questions by administering questionnaire. Some questions of yes or no type some had multiple choice. There was no time limit but they took approximately 10 to 15 minutes. Responses collected from the sample were computed into percentage and interpretation was done accordingly.

#### **Findings of social survey**

According to the responses of the students, 33.33% students used mobile according to their convenience, 26.66% felt that mobile had made you easily accessible to other people, 30% reported that it helped to communicate with friends easily while 10% were of the opinion that it was a better medium to get messages.

On the impact of cell phones on people's lives; 20% students agreed that mobile phones is a status symbol, 33% students were of the opinion that communicating with their friends has become a new form of entertainment- a richer experience, 11.66% students revealed that having a mobile phones is the key to their social life relations while 33.66% reported that mobile phones have influenced their education positively. About the most common place of their use; 66% reported that they used mobile phone at home, 13.33% used their phone in public transport, 3.33% at a place of worship, 0.12% used in school campus, 0.66% used it even in classroom also. 36.66% students revealed that they never use mobile for educational purpose, 27% said several times in a month, 24.34% used several times in a week and only 12% said that they use it several times in a day.

### GRAPH SHOWING USE OF MOBILE FOR EDUCATIONAL PURPOSE



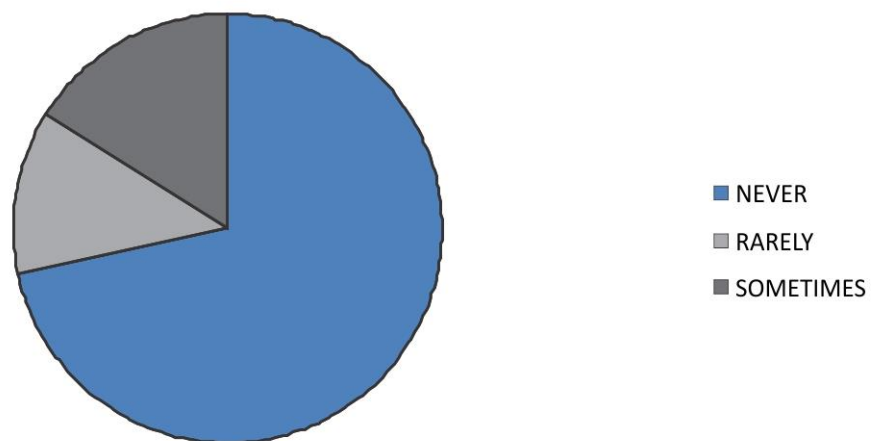
31.66% respondents revealed that they use mobile for accessing email, 26.34% for browsing social networking sites, 01.33% used it for weather information, 8.66% used it for driving

directing, 09.33% for sports news, 7.66% for local news, 06% for reviews, 8.66% for international news and 01.33% for accessing blogs.

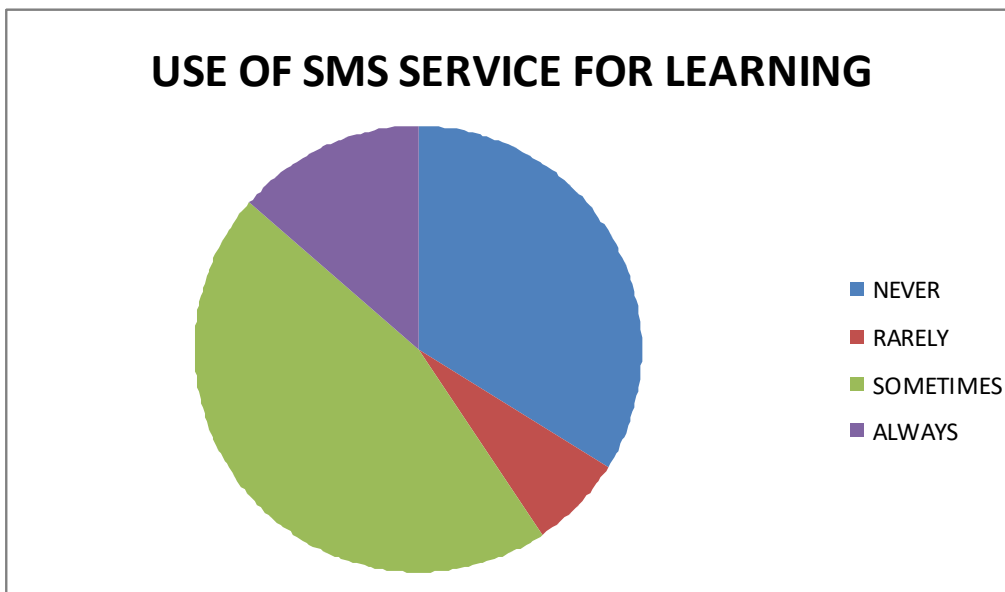
While responding for use of cell phones built in camera, 49.33% replied that they use camera for capturing family photos and videos, 20% used for capturing exhibitions, 26% for recording presentations and 04.66% used their mobiles phones for recording lectures.

71.66% students replied that they never use mobile while driving, 12.34% replied they used it rarely, 16% were of the opinion that they used it sometimes.

### GRAPH SHOWING USE OF MOBILE PHONE WHILE DRIVING

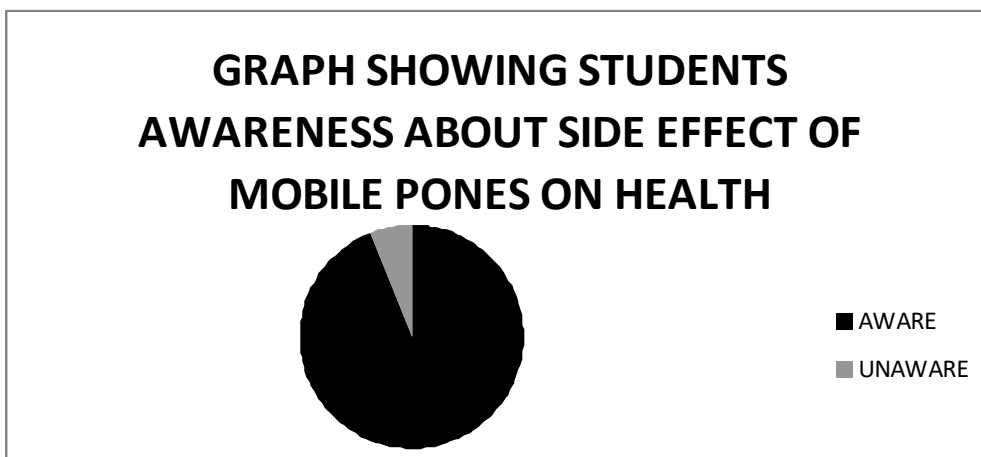


About the use of SMS service 33.33% students replied that they never used it for learning, 06.66% said they rarely use this service, 45% said they used it sometimes, only 13.33% students were of the opinion that they always use sms service for learning purpose.



94% students were of the opinion that mobile phone has become a necessity in the present scenario but 6% replied that it is not a necessity for them.

83% students were aware of the side effect of mobile use on health but 17% students were found unaware 46.66% students replied that its prolonged use would cause health problem, 20% were responded negatively, while 33.33% students gave no comments.



**Conclusions of the Survey:**

1. Mobile phone’s friendly features have attracted the masses.
2. Students are aware of the educational use of mobile phones.
3. Most of the students use mobile phones for assessing email and social networking.
4. Only few students use SMS services for learning purposes.
5. Students are aware that one should not use mobile phones while driving.
6. Students knew that prolonged use of mobile phone can affect the health.
